Four outings is a *minimum* that might suit experienced sailors. Even talented beginners need a multiple of this figure to master an Yngling. It is recommended that you accumulate sufficient expertise before registering for the test.

Tests (here is what you will be examined on).

This part is about what you will be examined upon. Once you are convinced your skill level is OK, you can register for the Y test (<https://bit.ly/YCC-Y-test>).

Theory of navigation rules and priorities, inside the harbour, on the lake. Boat **safety** and equipment check. Skipper knowledge of **weather, boat and crew**, and making decisions at the port. Task distribution + **organising** the crew.

Y boat name	Date	Improvement areas	My comments

Knots + purposes: bowline, figure of eight, round-turn-and-two-half-hitches, clove hitch (with extra half-hitch added for fenders), reef and sheet bend (for connecting ropes) and cleat hitch, done without hesitation (less than 10 sec)

Rigging and unrigging the boat (entirely done by the candidate)

Leave and return to the mooring. Mooring the boat to the dock appropriately. Boat Check before leaving.

Basic manoeuvres (announce and maintain the point of sailing, tacking, gybing), minimum 2 Bft

Advanced manoeuvres: 360 around a buoy at consistent distance, buoy stop), minimum 2 Bft

Inside harbour: sailing length of harbour channel, stop at rigging buoy, 360 around rigging buoy, min 2 Bft

Man overboard with heave-to (boat to come to standstill, 'man' to remain between shrouds and stern for min 5 seconds, reachable), min 2 Bft

High wind outing: min 3 or 4 beaufort. Leaving, returning and harbour manoeuvres

For the advanced manoeuvres ; the examiner will observe your capacity to execute the manoeuvre and to bring the boat back to the harbour safely.
