PRESIDENT'S WORD

After several years of reduced activity (Covid in 2020-21 and harbor dredging in 2022) we finally have a full season ahead of us! The club started with a first evening where old and new members meet at the welcome drink on March 30th followed by the launching of the fleet on April 1st where more than 80 members came to Port Choiseul in Versoix to prepare the beginning of the season. This rapidly allowed to make 10 boats available (1 dinghy, 4 ynglings, 4 large keelboats, and the Qboat), giving the greenlight to the new sailing season, in advance compared to previous years.

The yngling and Surprise courses started as soon as the boats became available. In the subsequent weeks, seven more dinghies became available and the last two keelboats (Mamma Mia and Jedi) are being prepared. This will allow the Dinghy courses to start around mid May followed by the catamaran preparations and courses.

The preparation of each boat usually requires several hours of work by multiple persons and requests multiple skills and venues to the harbour and multiple trips between CERN BA5, Versoix and shops for spare parts. We estimate that several hundreds of hours of work have been necessary to start the season and prepare the boats, so my sincere thanks to all our contributing members.

Another essential activity that has started is the Thursday practice every week at 18:00. This is the regular and main club event for all the members where people can meet, discuss, sail and make plans for further sailing activities which represent the club atmosphere. After the sailing, many members meet in one of the two buvettes to share their experience and pictures around a drink or even a dinner During the Thursday outings, members usually find sailing partners, crews are formed, and newcomers get integrated in the club.

This year, the club experienced a sudden increase of its membership with more than 100 new

members, many of them being beginners with little sailing experience.

We have also witnessed during the first Thursday practices a large attendance of our members (more than 50). This made the allocation of a boat to all participants particularly difficult. For this reason, in order to accommodate the maximum members on our boats, a huge effort has been devoted to speed up the preparation of the last boats. Moreover, a pre-registation to each Thurday practice has been put in place to better understand individual sailing preferences in order to better organize the event and invite more skippers to come to the harbor.

The current situation is normal as we have many motivated beginners at the beginning of the season while skippers often prefer warmer weather and water, especially when sailing dinghies and catamarans.

However, while we are confident that the situation will normalize in the coming weeks, I would like to call skippers to come to the Thursday outings to meet club newcomers. We expect more sun, warmer water and fair winds in the coming weeks!

FLEET STATUS

Thanks to the efforts of many volunteers, almost all boats have been prepared and are now ready for sailing.

Again this Sunday 30 April, a few members spent long hours to put our Surprise Mamma Mia from its storage place at CERN to Port Choiseul. This was preceded by a huge maintenance work to repair the hull, put multiple layers of anti fouling and protection products under the wise supervision of Tim and François.

THURSDAY PRACTICE





Our Thursday evening outings started already mid April and gathered many enthousiastic sailors!

Sessions are held every week on Thursday, starting at 6:00 pm sharp in Port Choiseul.

YNGLING CORNER



Yngling skippers and crew, please be aware that there have been some problems for which we need everyone's help: The jib halyards have reportedly become quite tight and difficult to get hooked onto the tensioners.

If this happens to you, please check the Dyneema halyard (silver-coloured cord with shackle that attaches to head of the jib): there should be NO TWIST in the Dyneema, even if you try to let it swing freely in an attempt to 'untwist' it. It has likely been under much tension for such a long time that the twist has settled. If there is any twist at all, pull the Dyneema mostly out of the mast, and untwist it in the opposite direction - please note, you might need to untwist it dozens and dozens of times, until it is almost twisting in the opposite direction!

The Yngling jibs are showing damage because they have been folded to get them into the net - Please DO NOT FOLD any jibs, but roll them, put in the black bag and set them under the net, into the cockpit. On Janisico and Vas-y, you might be able to store the rolled jib on the side shelf under the deck to keep it dry.

Also some sailors reported Janisico's jib tensioner being stuck and hard to release. If this happens to you, please pull out the green knot near the bottom, outside of the tensioner, and it should then be much easier.
