WORK IN THE HARBOUR

Following the complete refurbishing of the Port Choiseul harbour this winter, a new area on the ground will be allocated to our boats. The committee is working on identifying the places for catamarans and dinghies by early May.



BOAT STATUS

- One second hand Tiger Catamaran, Netcat. It is being refurbished with new equipment and expected to be ready in the next weeks.
- One new J70, Joda, expected ready in July.

HELPER SHIFTS

The first batch of surveillance shifts was opened and filled in 4 days. If you did not get a spot, do not worry! With upcoming regattas, D and Y Tuesday outings, about 150-200 more slots are expected over the course of the season. Moreover, as in the previous season, many maintenance tasks will be posted during the course of the year.

PERFORMANCE AT SSL

YCC's momentum in the Swiss Sailing league continues to grow and this year YCC will compete in three different leagues: Challenge, Promotion and Women's.

The 2024 season started strongly with the team (skipper Elia Borrego, Kate Robertson, Andres

Vieitez and Nathalie Birt) securing second place overall after seven hard fought races in Act 1 of the Challenge League on 20 - 21 April in Ascona. Conditions over the weekend were varied and challenging: gusts of 30 knots with 30 degree wind shifts on day one and very light, patchy winds on day two.

- The <u>Geneva Sailing School</u> (14 quai du Mont-Banc) has a fleet of keelboats: one Beneteau First Class 7.50, one Beneteau First Class 8, one Surprise and one Yemanja. Plus a motorboat for motorboat classes, a Bayliner with a 130 HP engine.

CHINA SAILING RACE
