SEPTEMBER CRUISE

Report from Marco:

Between 31st August and 7th September, our club celebrated a major milestone with the 2024 Jeune Genevois Cruise, which took place off the beautiful coast of Split, Croatia. This edition of the cruise saw the highest participation in YCC history, with 68 members aboard nine yachts, ranging from 12 to 15 meters in length. The turnout is a testament to the enthusiasm within YCC, making this one of the most memorable cruises to date.

The Split coastline offered an ideal yet challenging setting. Conditions ranged from sunny skies to strong winds, calm lulls and even a few thunderstorms. This dynamic weather added an extra layer of excitement, demanding skill and adaptability from all aboard. Despite the occasional rough patch, Split proved to be a great choice for the Jeune Genevois Cruise, offering a great mix of adventure and beauty, with endless options of routes around its numerous islands.

Yachts gathered in bays for moments of rest and relaxation before setting off again the day after. The fleet sailed independently during the day, creating a sense of freedom and exploration, but in the evening, the boats would regroup here and there, where the YCC spirit took the form of lively parties and shared experiences.

YCC is deeply grateful to the nine skippers, Silvia, Alfons, Andreas, Dan, Federico, Jochen, Jorge,

Manfred, and Marco, who led the fleet and ensured safety and enjoyment of participants. The execution of this large-scale event is owed in no small part to Jorge and Marco. SAILING PERMIT

The rules "Reglement" of the club have been modified to include new articles describing the sailing and motor permit requirements for skipping YCC boats.

The good news is that it has been clarified that no motor permit is required to use the RIB while you are in Swiss waters. The bad news is that a Sailing permit is now mandatory to skip all YCC boats with more than 15 m2 of sail surface.

You can consult new articles in rules 6.7 to 6.17.



The weekly Yngling and Dinghy practice sessions, organized during summer by our two enthousiastic members, Silvia Costantini and Paul Smith, had a lot of success. Silvia and Paul are thanked for their commitment and motivation.

Reports from Silvia (for Y) and Paul (for D): The Y and D practice sessions were very popular with at least twice the number of subscriptions than available places.

Also, thanks to our volunteer skippers, a Yngling day was organized in August, and a couple of additional outings in September were added following popular demand. For the first time this year the D and Y practices have been scheduled on different days (Tuesdays and Fridays, respectively), allowing many enthusiastic sailors to take part in both. Short and fun paddling regattas took place in case of total lack of wind.

The Dinghy Tuesdays series, held from 2nd July to 27th August, was a resounding success. Across eight sessions, an average of 25 participants registered for the 12 to 17 available spots. The program attracted a diverse group of sailors, ranging from experienced D-key holders to novices, encouraging both teamwork and skill development as crews were formed.

Guided by the Q-boat, the sessions featured several short regattas, offering a well-balanced mix of competitive sailing and cooperation. Each session concluded with a debrief at the CNV, allowing participants to exchange insights and connect socially."







THURSDAY PRACTICE

Eino Tiirinen (skipper), Simon Marti, Adelaide Davis and Emmet Ryan represented the club with fighting spirit, winning some of their races and finishing 7th overall out of a fleet of 18 clubs.

TRANSLEMANIQUE EN SOLITAIRE

After 28 hours, 13 minutes, and 52 seconds, Farhad Farhad Irannejad successfully finished the Translémanique en Solitaire on our Jedi and returned to Geneva. This year's race took place under extremely challenging conditions, with 8 Beaufort winds and rain. Despite the storm, which

caused many boats to abandon the race, Farhad persevered and crossed the finish line within the time limit.
